## KISTLER BASS RANCH CHECK LIST

## Wading gear:

Waders.

Wading belt.

Wading boots.

Float tube. They allow you to move along shorelines while casting into cover, like trees, that cannot easily be reached from shore. Later in the day as the fish move into deeper water you can search for them with a sinking line. Although not a productive as a floating device, you can walk and wade fish these ponds.

Booties.

Flippers.

PFD. (KBR requires it if you are using any kind of floating device)

## Fishing gear:

9' 6wt fly rod with WF6F line, 9' 3X Bass leader.

9' 7wt fly rod with WF7 sink tip fly line, 6' leader.

Fishing license.

Vest with normal fly fishing tools.

Selection of bass flies. Bass poppers, frogs, large wooly buggers in chartreuse, black, olive, Umpqua Swimming frog, Meat Whistle in chartreuse, black, olive or large leeches in the same colors. There are many different bass flies that will work. a selection of top water and sinking patterns will allow you to cover the water most effectively. FishFirst! fly shop in Albany has a good selection of bass flies as well as everything else you'll need. (I know, I work there).

## Clothing:

Wading under garments.

Jacket.

Cool weather shirt. (it is usually cool in the morning and evening, but warm in the afternoon and possibly windy).

Warm weather shirt.

Change of clothes (just in case you slip in)

Sunglasses.

Hat.

Buff.

Sun Gloves.

Misc:

Sunscreen.

Camera.

Water.

Lunch.

Dinner. (Last outing some of us stopped at House Of Beef in Oakdale for dinner)
